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Dear Donor,

Please find below the annual report of Foundation **The Gambian Children First**, which is very special this year. We also include the financial statements covering the period running from August 2019 up to and including July 2020.

In the school year 2019-2020, we were able to support a total of 110 pupils (mainly girls). Last school year, we collected almost € 18,000 in regular donations. We thank everyone for the generous contributions.

Of course, we hope that you will continue to give. As a consequence of the impact of Covid-19, it was impossible to realise quite a number of initiatives, which means that the Foundation has missed out on income. Due to the weakened financial situation in the schools, support is needed more than ever. After a lengthy lockdown, the skill centres reopened half October 2020. Little by little, they try to remediate learning deficits.

We are proud that our projects are still concrete, small-scale, and focused on individuals. Money does not end up in the wrong hands and we work with local experts.

For the school year 2020-2021, the average costs are still about € 155 per pupil. Of course, you are free to give more, or less: each contribution is welcome.

Annual visit cancelled



This year, we write a special report about school year 2019-2020. The outbreak of the Covid-19 virus has confronted the world with an unprecedented situation of restrictions, ill people and deaths.

Due to Covid-19, the board of the

Foundation has not been able to make the annual visit. The tickets were already booked and our shelter had been organised, but it turned out to be absolutely impossible to go. What a disappointment for us <u>and</u> for the people in our network in Gambia!

Nevertheless, we have been able to maintain contact with the schools by way of our local representative, whom we asked to make the visits for us. We can therefore report on his findings regarding the situation.

Situation in the schools during the lockdown



This school year, the Foundation has sponsored a total of 110 students in the schools and institutions. Until March 2019, everything went fine in the schools. But then, half March, the entire country was locked down. This was an economic disaster for everyone in poverty-stricken Gambia. Tourism completely disappeared. Hotels remained empty, taxis did not drive, markets were closed and more or less everyone in the

country was left without income. This led to high unemployment levels and a complete lack of prospects.

Educational institutions were closed from half March to half October 2020. In first grade, only the eldest pupils were allowed to go to school in June to do their exams. The skill centres reopened their doors only in October 2020.

In most cases, the schools aimed at a faster graduation of the students, or at remediating their learning deficits. From January 2021, the school year 2020-2021 started and it continued until August. At the moment of writing, we were in touch with the schools to set the number of students. We are proud that we can now also support the members of the boards of the schools and the students. Thanks to you!



The schools have been hit very hard by the absence of the students. All non-sponsored pupils pay the school fees by instalments. As they had to stay at home, the schools did not receive anything at all. Notably, a private school such as Taku Leggaye could no longer pay the salaries of the teachers.



Gambia has 2.2 million inhabitants. There are only a few (somewhat bigger) hospitals that are not well equipped for such a pandemic. Is it thanks to the obligation to wear a mask, the lengthy lockdown or the warm weather and life outside that the number of registered Covid-19 cases is relatively low? Who knows. It is positive that this poor country was not hit exceptionally hard by the number of patients, while it was strongly affected by the economic consequences of the pandemic.

Due to the lengthy lockdown, many people have seen their income evaporate. Without money, food cannot be bought. The honorary consul of the Netherlands in Gambia, Mrs Henriette Sonko, has asked us for help to breathe new live into the Women's Garden in Sutukoba.



The garden, already equipped with a well, used to flourish and was full of vegetables and fruit. However, it decayed because the wooden fence was ruined by cows, goats, monkeys and donkeys. Around 60 women would very much like to be able to grow crops again, in order to provide their families with healthy food.

Our previous local manager Phoday Touray was born in Sutukoba. He was closely involved in the foundation of the Women's Garden. It is therefore a great pleasure to him that we want to help the people in the village of his birth.
